AN ACT concerning

Baltimore City - Sheriff's Office - Appointed Positions

FOR the purpose of altering the positions to be appointed by the Baltimore City Sheriff.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings
Section 2-309(d)(1)
Annotated Code of Maryland
(2002 Replacement Volume)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings

2-309.

(d) (1) (i) In Baltimore City, the Sheriff shall receive an expense allowance of \$1,000 per year and a salary of:

1. \$70,000 in calendar year 2002;
2. \$70,000 in calendar year 2003;
3. \$72,000 in calendar year 2004;
4. \$72,000 in calendar year 2005; and
5. \$74,000 in calendar year 2006 and thereafter.

(ii) The Sheriff:

1. Shall appoint an undersheriff or chief deputy sheriff, ONE ASSISTANT SHERIFF, two deputy sheriff majors, two deputy sheriff captains, four deputy sheriff lieutenants, four deputy sheriff sergeants, [one administrative officer II sheriff,] one secretary sheriff, [one fiscal associate II sheriff,] and one fiscal clerk sheriff; and

2. May appoint a total of 83 deputy sheriffs.
