S.B. 558

WHEREAS, Teachers <u>and school administrators</u> leaving the profession routinely state that poor working conditions in the schools, including the burdensome paperwork issues, are most to blame; and

WHEREAS, Because we already face a teacher shortage in Maryland and the recently passed federal law, No Child Left Behind Act, establishes additional pressures with federal mandates; and

WHEREAS, It is important to address any condition that contributes to teacher <u>and school administrator</u> attrition and interferes with <del>teachers'</del> <u>educators'</u> ability to devote their time, attention, and talent to meeting the instructional needs of their students; now, therefore,

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That:
- (a) There is a Study Commission on  $\overline{\text{Teachers'}}$   $\underline{\textit{Educators'}}$  Time and Paperwork.
  - (b) The Commission shall consist of the following 13 14 16 members:
- (1) one representative of the State Department of Education, appointed by the State Superintendent;
- (2) three <u>five</u> representatives from local school systems, including at least one <u>three</u> local school administrator <u>administrators</u>, selected by the Maryland Association of Boards of Education;
- (3) one representative of a disability advocacy community appointed by the Governor;
- (4) one speech-language pathologist who is employed as a speech-language pathologist in the public schools, appointed by the State Board of Audiologists, Hearing Aid Dispensers, and Speech-Language Pathologists;
- (5) four teachers, three selected by the largest statewide employee union representing teachers and one teacher selected by the second largest public employee union as follows:
  - (i) two with expertise in general education;
  - (ii) one with expertise in special education; and
  - (iii) one with expertise in special services;
- (5) (6) two members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of the Senate; and
- (6) (7) two members of the House of Delegates, appointed by the Speaker of the House.
  - (c) The Commission shall designate the chairman of the Commission.
