SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Health - General

17 - 214.

- (a) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
 - (10) "Specimen" means:
 - (i) Blood derived from the human body;
 - (ii) Urine derived from the human body; [or]
- (iii) Hair derived from the human body as provided in subsection (b)(2) of this section; OR
 - (IV) SALIVA DERIVED FROM THE HUMAN BODY.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2003.
