THE GOVERNOR SHALL APPOINT A CHAIRPERSON FROM AMONG THE BOARD MEMBERS.

(E) MEETINGS.

THE BOARD SHALL MEET AS NECESSARY, BUT AT LEAST ONCE EACH QUARTER.

(F) COMPENSATION: REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES.

## A MEMBER OF THE BOARD:

- (1) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A MEMBER OF THE BOARD; BUT
- (2) IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.
  - (G) STAFF.

THE SECRETARY SHALL PROVIDE STAFF TO THE BOARD, INCLUDING A COORDINATOR WHO IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE DAILY OPERATION OF THE OFFICE OF THE BOARD.

In subsection (b)(2)(i) of this section, the former reference to a telephone "utility" company is deleted for consistency with the terminology used throughout this subtitle.
