If the Board of Trustees approves an application for disability retirement for a member of the State Police Retirement System that was filed by the Secretary of the State Police under § 29-103(c) of this subtitle or [Article 88B, § 15(b)(16) of the Code] § 2-415(B) OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY ARTICLE, the member:

- (1) within 90 days after approval, may exercise an option as provided under §§ 21-402 and 21-403 of this article; or
- (2) shall receive the basic allowance.

(e-1) (1) In this subsection, "law enforcement officer" means a law enforcement officer as defined in [Article 27, § 727 (b) of the Code] § 3-101 OF THE PUBLIC SAFETY ARTICLE or other sworn law enforcement officer of the United States, a state, or a political subdivision of a state.
