- (1) Defining which health care methods are complementary medical methods being used by physicians in Maryland;
- (2) Evaluating the costs, benefits, and risks associated with the use of complementary medical methods;
- (3) Determining how best to inform patients of the benefits and risks associated with the use of complementary medical methods and the availability of other methods of treatment; and
- (4) Reporting recommendations on complementary medical methods in accordance with this section.
- (d) The members of the Commission shall select a chairperson from the membership of the Commission.
  - (e) Members of the Commission shall serve without compensation.
- (f) The Commission shall report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, subject to § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly by December 1, 1995 and thereafter terminate its existence.
- (g) Staff for the Commission shall be provided by the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene.]

- (d) For the purpose of this subtitle, a place of public accommodation means:
  - (4) Any establishment [which]:
- (i) 1. [Is] THAT IS physically located within the premises of any establishment otherwise covered by this section; or
- 2. Within the premises of which is physically located any establishment otherwise covered by this section; and
- (ii) [Which] THAT holds itself out as serving patrons of such covered establishment.
