- (2) A peace officer who personally has observed the individual; or
- (3) Any other interested person.
- (c) (1) A petition under this section shall:
 - (i) Be signed and verified by the petitioner;
 - (ii) State the petitioner's:
 - 1. Name:
 - 2. Address; and
 - 3. Home and work telephone numbers;
 - (iii) State the emergency evaluee's:
 - 1. Name; and
 - 2. Description;
 - (iv) State the following information, if available:
 - 1. The address of the emergency evaluee; and
- 2. The name and address of the spouse or a child, parent, or other relative of the emergency evaluee or any other individual who is interested in the emergency evaluee;
- (v) Contain a description of the behavior and statements of the emergency evaluee that led the petitioner to believe that the emergency evaluee has a mental disorder and that there is clear and imminent danger of the emergency evaluee's doing bodily harm to the emergency evaluee or another; and
- (vi) Contain any other facts that support the need for an emergency evaluation.
 - (2) The petition form shall contain a notice that the petitioner:
 - (i) May be required to appear before a court; and
 - (ii) Makes the statements under penalties of perjury.
- (d) (1) A petitioner who is a physician, psychologist, clinical social worker, LICENSED CLINICAL PROFESSIONAL COUNSELOR, health officer, or designee of a health officer shall give the petition to a peace officer.
 - (2) The peace officer shall explain to the petitioner:
 - (i) The serious nature of the petition; and
 - (ii) The meaning and content of the petition.
