in a position as a staff employee of the educational institution that was eligible for membership in the Teachers' Retirement System or Teachers' Pension System under Chapter 6, § 8, paragraphs 1(a) and 2(a) of the Acts of 1994; [or]

- (5) an employee who is not a member of a State system and who accepts a position for which the budgeted hours per fiscal year are less than 500 hours in the first fiscal year of employment; OR
- (6) A NONFACULTY EMPLOYEE OF THE BALTIMORE CITY COMMUNITY COLLEGE WHO BECOMES EMPLOYED ON OR AFTER OCTOBER 1, 2002, OR WHO TRANSFERS TO THE EMPLOYEES' PENSION SYSTEM IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 23–202.1 OF THIS SUBTITLE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October July 1, 2002.

- (a) The licensing requirements of this title do not apply to:
- (6) A new resident of this State during the first [30] 60 days of residency, if:
- (i) The individual has a valid license issued by the state of which the individual formerly was a resident;
