- (F) (E) (1) "MECHANICAL RESTRAINT" MEANS THE USE OF ANY DEVICE OR MATERIAL ATTACHED OR ADJACENT TO THE STUDENT'S BODY THAT RESTRICTS FREEDOM OF MOVEMENT OR NORMAL ACCESS TO ANY PORTION OF THE STUDENT'S BODY AND THAT THE STUDENT CANNOT EASILY REMOVE.
- (2) "MECHANICAL RESTRAINT" DOES NOT INCLUDE A PROTECTIVE OR STABILIZING DEVICE ORDERED BY A PHYSICIAN WHEN IT IS USED AS PRESCRIBED.
- (C) (1) "NONEXCLUSIONARY TIME OUT" MEANS THE CIRCUMSTANCE IN WHICH A STUDENT IS NOT REMOVED FROM THE CLASSROOM SETTING, BUT RATHER IS DENIED ACCESS TO CLASSROOM PARTICIPATION:
- (2) "NONEXCLUSIONARY TIME OUT" INCLUDES THE CIRCUMSTANCE IN WHICH A STUDENT IS MOVED TO THE EDGE OF AN ACTIVITY WHEREBY THE STUDENT DOES NOT PARTICIPATE IN THE ACTIVITY BUT MAY STILL OBSERVE OTHER STUDENTS' BEHAVIOR AND PARTICIPATION IN THE ACTIVITY.
- (F) "NONPUBLIC SCHOOL" MEANS A SCHOOL THAT RECEIVES FUNDS FROM THE DEPARTMENT FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING SPECIAL EDUCATION AND RELATED SERVICES TO STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES.
- (H) (G) (1) "PHYSICAL RESTRAINT" MEANS THE USE OF PHYSICAL FORCE, WITHOUT THE USE OF ANY DEVICE OR MATERIAL, TO RESTRICT THE FREE MOVEMENT OF ALL OR A PORTION OF A STUDENT'S BODY.
 - (2) "PHYSICAL RESTRAINT" DOES NOT INCLUDE:
- (I) BRIEFLY HOLDING A STUDENT IN ORDER TO CALM OR COMFORT THE STUDENT;
- (II) HOLDING A STUDENT'S HAND OR ARM TO ESCORT THE STUDENT SAFELY FROM ONE AREA TO ANOTHER; Θ R
- (III) MOVING A DISRUPTIVE STUDENT WHO IS UNWILLING TO LEAVE THE AREA WHEN OTHER METHODS SUCH AS COUNSELING HAVE BEEN UNSUCCESSFUL; \overline{OR}
- $\underline{\text{(IV)}}$ Breaking up a fight in the school building or on school grounds.
- (H) (H) "SECLUSION" MEANS THE CONFINEMENT OF A STUDENT IN A LOCKED ROOM, CLOSET, BOX, OR OTHER SPACE FROM WHICH THE STUDENT IS PHYSICALLY PREVENTED FROM LEAVING.
- (J) "TIME-OUT ROOM OR OTHER AREA" MEANS A SPACE THAT ENCOMPASSES AT LEAST 40 SQUARE FEET OF FLOOR SPACE AND THAT IS:
 - (1) LICHTED:
 - (2) VENTILATED:
 - (3) UNLOCKED: AND
