- [(c)] (F) "Local coordinating council" means a local [coordinating] council [for residential placement of children with disabilities] THAT COORDINATES SERVICES FOR CHILDREN DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTIONS (C) AND (D) OF THIS SECTION.
 - (G) (1) "RESIDENTIAL PLACEMENT" MEANS A PLACEMENT IN:
- (I) A HOSPITAL, <u>UNDER CIRCUMSTANCES DESCRIBED IN SUBCABINET REGULATIONS</u>;
 - (II) A RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT CENTER; OR
 - (III) · A RESIDENTIAL SCHOOL; OR
- - (2) "RESIDENTIAL PLACEMENT" DOES NOT INCLUDE A PLACEMENT IN:
- (I) A FACILITY ESTABLISHED UNDER ARTICLE 83C, § 2–117 OF THE CODE; OR
- (II) FOSTER CARE, AS DEFINED IN § 5-501 OF THE FAMILY LAW ARTICLE.

- (a) The members of the Council are:
- (1) The Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene or the Secretary's designee;
 - (2) The Secretary of Human Resources or the Secretary's designee;
- (3) The State Superintendent of Schools or the Superintendent's designee;
- (4) The Director of the Governor's Office for Individuals with Disabilities, as a nonvoting, ex officio member;
- (5) The Special Secretary [of the Office] for Children, Youth, and Families or the Special Secretary's designee; and
- (6) The Secretary of [the Department of] Juvenile Justice or the Secretary's designee.
- (b) (1) There is a chairman of the Council who shall serve a term of 12 months in 5-year cycles of rotation as provided in this subsection.
