

- (3) The Special Secretary shall serve as chairperson of the Committee.
- (4) In developing the plan, the Committee shall consult with the following:
- (i) representatives from each of the following:
    - 1. local governments;
    - 2. local departments of social services;
    - 3. local health departments;
    - 4. local coordinating councils;
    - 5. local juvenile justice areas;
    - 6. core service agencies; and
    - 7. Developmental Disabilities Administration regional offices;
  - (ii) parents of children with special needs;
  - (iii) private residential and day services providers;
  - (iv) child advocacy organizations;
  - (v) former consumers of special needs services who are at least 18 years of age;
  - (vi) a representative of the Maryland Health Care Commission; and
  - (vii) any other person the Special Secretary deems necessary.

(f) The Subcabinet plan shall be submitted to the Governor and the General Assembly and published in the Maryland Register.

SECTION 4-5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect ~~October~~ July 1, 2002. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end of June 30, 2005, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
