terms of the members of the Advisory Committee; requiring certain technologists to only practice under the supervision of a licensed physician; providing that the failure of a licensed physician to properly supervise certain technologists is unprofessional conduct in the practice of medicine; providing that the practice of certain technologists is limited to certain practice listed in regulation; prohibiting the practice of radiation oncology/therapy technology, medical radiation technology, or nuclear medicine technology without a certificate; prohibiting a licensed physician from employing an individual practicing radiation oncology/therapy technology, medical radiation technology, nuclear medicine technology without a certificate; specifying the qualifications for certification as a radiation oncology/therapy technologist, medical radiation technologist, and nuclear medicine technologist; authorizing the Board to adopt a certain internship program; providing for the application of this Act; establishing an application process and requirements for certification as a radiation oncology/therapy, medical radiation, or nuclear medicine technologist; specifying the expiration date of certain certificates and requiring the Board to send a certain renewal notice by a certain date; authorizing the renewal and reinstatement of certain certificates under certain circumstances; requiring the Board to place certain certificates on inactive status under certain eircumstances and to change a certificates to active status under certain circumstances; prohibiting the surrender of certain certificates under certain circumstances; authorizing the Board to deny a certificate to certain applicants, reprimand certain certified individuals, place certain certified individuals on probation, or to suspend or revoke certain certificates under certain circumstances; specifying certain grounds for discipline of certified radiation oncology/therapy technologists, medical radiation technologists, or nuclear medicine technologists subject to certain hearing requirements; requiring certain entities to report certain employment actions or termination of employment of radiation oncology/therapy, medical radiation, and nuclear medicine technologists; providing certain exceptions to the reporting requirement under certain circumstances; authorizing the Board to reinstate certain revoked certificates; prohibiting a person from making certain representations or from providing, attempting to provide, or offering to provide certain care unless authorized to practice radiation oncology/therapy technology, medical radiation technology, or nuclear medicine technology; establishing certain penalties for a violation of this Act; providing that the Advisory Committee is subject to the provisions of the Maryland Program Evaluation Act; defining certain terms; and generally relating to radiation oncology/therapy technologists, medical radiation technologists, and nuclear technologists.
