SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section(s) 14-607 and 14-608, respectively, of Article - Health Occupations of the Annotated Code of Maryland be renumbered to be Section(s) 14-606 and 14-607, respectively.

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2002.

CHAPTER 374

(House Bill 533)

AN ACT concerning

Maryland Physician Assistants Act - Revisions

FOR the purpose of clarifying the practice responsibilities of a physician assistant and a supervising physician; adding to the list of items required to be included in a delegation agreement between the physician assistant and supervising physician; altering the actions that the State Board of Physician Quality Assurance may take after reviewing a delegation agreement; altering the manner in which a physician may supervise a physician assistant; exempting individual members of the Board from civil liability for certain actions; authorizing the Board to assess a certain fee and providing for the use of the fees assessed; authorizing the Board to assess a civil penalty for a violation of the law regulating the delegation of duties to physician assistants; providing for the use of the civil penalties assessed; altering certain provisions pertaining to physician assistants and medication orders; adding certain clarifying language; defining a certain term; altering certain definitions; making stylistic changes; providing that this Act may not be construed to prevent certain physician assistants from performing certain medical acts involving general anesthesia under certain circumstances; requiring certain organizations to submit a certain report to certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date; and generally relating to the Maryland Physician Assistants Act.
