## 3-902. VISUAL SURVEILLANCE WITH PRURIENT INTENT.

- (A) DEFINITIONS.
- (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED.
- (2) "CAMERA" INCLUDES ANY ELECTRONIC DEVICE THAT CAN BE USED SURREPTITIOUSLY TO OBSERVE AN INDIVIDUAL.
- (3) "PRIVATE PLACE" MEANS A DRESSING ROOM, BEDROOM, OR REST ROOM IN:
  - (I) AN OFFICE, BUSINESS, OR STORE;
  - (II) A RECREATIONAL FACILITY:
  - (III) A RESTAURANT OR TAVERN;
  - (IV) A HOTEL, MOTEL, OR OTHER LODGING FACILITY;
  - (V) A THEATER OR SPORTS ARENA;
  - (VI) A SCHOOL OR OTHER EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION:
  - (VII) A BANK OR OTHER FINANCIAL INSTITUTION:

 $\left( \text{VIII}\right) \text{ANY PART OF A DAY CARE HOME USED FOR THE CARE AND CUSTODY OF A CHILD; OR$ 

- (IX) ANOTHER PLACE OF PUBLIC USE OR ACCOMMODATION.
- (4) (I) "VISUAL SURVEILLANCE" MEANS THE DELIBERATE, SURREPTITIOUS OBSERVATION OF AN INDIVIDUAL BY ANY MEANS.
  - (II) "VISUAL SURVEILLANCE" INCLUDES SURVEILLANCE BY:
    - DIRECT SIGHT;
    - 2. THE USE OF MIRRORS; OR
    - 3. THE USE OF CAMERAS.
