- (2) 2 members in 2004; and
- (3) 3 members in 2005.

SECTION 2. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three—fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.

## Governor's Emergency Powers

FOR the purpose of specifying the Governor's authority under certain circumstances; requiring certain State or eounty <u>local</u> law enforcement officers and health officers to execute and enforce certain orders, rules and regulations made by the Governor under certain circumstances; providing certain penalties for a violation of an order, rule or regulation made by the Governor under certain circumstances; requiring certain State officials to carry out the Governor's policies; authorizing the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene to perform certain duties under certain circumstances; modifying certain definitions; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to the Governor's emergency powers.
