4. The balance to the General Fund.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall take effect upon the taking effect of Chapter \_\_\_ (S.B. 323) of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2002. If Chapter \_\_\_ (S.B. 323) takes effect, then with no further action required by the General Assembly, Section 1 of this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

SECTION 2- 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, subject to Section 3 of this Act, this Act shall take effect July June 1, 2002.

Dear Mr. President:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed Senate Bill 639 - Maryland Security Protection Act of 2002.

This bill seeks to enhance State security by: (1) expanding coverage of the Wiretap Act; (2) expanding the territorial limits of the Maryland Transportation Authority; (3) requiring the use of security ID badges in airports; (4) expanding the powers of security officers at nuclear power plant facilities; and (5) creating a new crime of knowingly or fraudulently obtaining a commercial driver's license by misrepresentation.

House Bill 1036, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 639.

AN ACT concerning

**Maryland Security Protection Act of 2002**

FOR the purpose of ~~prohibiting certain persons, businesses, contractors, or other entities from charging unconscionably excessive prices for certain goods and services during a state of emergency; allowing a certain civil action and certain relief, allowing the adoption of certain regulations concerning charging for~~
