- (4) Any condition that may endanger health through the spreading of the condition by any means, including by streams, surface drainage, air currents, winged life, domestic animals, or human beings.
- (b)] In Cecil County or Allegany County, in addition to any other penalty imposed by this subtitle, a person who refuses or neglects to comply with a notice or order to abate a nuisance by the Secretary, or by the health officer for the county where the nuisance exists, is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$100 a day for each day the violation continues.

Dear Mr. Speaker:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 686 - State Board of Examiners of Psychologists - Powers and Duties.

This bill extends the amount of time, from 60 days to 120 days, that the State Board of Examiners of Psychologists has for notifying a licensed psychologist of a complaint and forwarding the complaint to the licensee. Such notice need not be provided if the board disposes of the complaint within 120 days of the date the complaint was received. The bill also provides that a decision of the board to enforce a suspension of a license for more than one year may not be stayed pending judicial review.

Senate Bill 327, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign House Bill 686.
