to obtain a certain court order prohibiting the provider from further violation of this Act under certain circumstances; establishing that it is the policy of the State to encourage providers to establish certain informal dispute settlement procedures; establishing that the provider is liable to the person guaranteed for wrongful breach of a service contract; authorizing the person guaranteed to file a certain court action if the provider breaches any duties under this Act; authorizing certain costs and expenses under certain circumstances; authorizing a provider to make a guaranty in addition to entering into a service contract; authorizing a provider to designate a representative; providing that this Act provides a certain exclusive remedy with certain exceptions; providing that certain persons need not comply with the Insurance Article under certain circumstances; altering certain definitions; adding certain definitions; making certain stylistic changes; and generally relating to the Maryland Service Contracts and Consumer Products Guaranty Act.

Subtitle 4. MARYLAND SERVICE CONTRACTS AND Consumer Products Guaranty Act. 14–401.
