

(6) If a voter requires assistance under [paragraphs] PARAGRAPH (4) or (5) of this subsection, the election judge shall record, on a form prescribed by the State Board, the name of the voter who required assistance and the name of the individual providing assistance to the voter.

(7) Except as provided in [paragraphs] PARAGRAPH (3) or (4) of this subsection, [a person] AN INDIVIDUAL over the age of [10] ~~14~~ 12 years may not accompany a voter into a voting booth.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect ~~October~~ June 1, 2004.

(House Bill 76)

AN ACT concerning

Crimes - Intentionally Causing a Person to Ingest Contaminating Food or Drink - Bodily Fluid or Bodily Substance Knowingly and Willfully Causing Another to Ingest Bodily Fluid

~~FOR the purpose of establishing the crime of intentionally causing a person to ingest bodily fluid without consent or by force or threat of force; defining a certain term; and generally relating to intentionally causing a person to ingest bodily fluid prohibiting a person from knowingly and willfully contaminating, attempting to contaminate, or conspiring to contaminate any drink, food, food product, or food supply by adding bodily fluid or a bodily substance; and generally relating to contaminating food or drink causing another to ingest bodily fluid without consent or by force or threat of force; establishing certain penalties; and generally relating to causing a person to ingest bodily fluid.~~
