(II) IF THE PETITION INVOLVES A CHALLENGE TO A CANDIDATE FOR AN OFFICE THAT IS TO BE CONTESTED AT AN ELECTION IN THE YEAR OF A PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION, NO LATER THAN 11 WEEKS BEFORE THAT ELECTION.

(2) JUDICIAL REVIEW OF ANY PETITION THAT IS FILED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) (B) OF THIS SECTION SHALL BE EXPEDITED BY THE CIRCUIT COURT THAT HEARS THE CAUSE TO THE EXTENT NECESSARY IN CONSIDERATION OF THE DEADLINES ESTABLISHED BY LAW, AND IN NO CASE, LONGER THAN 7 DAYS FROM THE DATE THE PETITION IS FILED.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2004.
