- (a) For each individual who seeks to vote, an election judge, in accordance with instructions provided by the local board, shall:
- (3) [establishing] ESTABLISH the identity of the voter by requesting the voter to state the month and day of the voter's birth and comparing the response to the information listed in the precinct register;
 - (4) [verifying] VERIFY the address of the voter's residence;
- (5) if any changes to the voting authority card are indicated by a voter, [making] MAKE the appropriate changes in information on the card or other appropriate form; and
- (6) [having] HAVE the voter sign the voting authority card and either [issuing] ISSUE the voter a ballot or [sending] SEND the voter to a machine to vote.
- (c) (7) Except as provided in [paragraphs] PARAGRAPH (3) or (4) of this subsection, a person over the age of 10 years may not accompany a voter into a voting booth.
