(3) Completed at least two clinical affiliations totaling at least 800 hours; and

(4) Completed a preceptorship that fulfills the requirements set by the Board].

(c) If an applicant is currently licensed in any other state, the Board may waive the preceptorship requirement.

(a) Subject to subsection (b) of this section, a physical therapist assistant license authorizes the licensee to practice limited physical therapy while the license is effective.
