copying by certain persons except under certain circumstances; authorizing a cooperative housing corporation to impose a reasonable charge upon a person desiring to review or copy the books and records; authorizing a council of unit owners of a condominium to withhold books and records kept by or on behalf of the council of unit owners from public inspection under certain circumstances; authorizing a council of unit owners of a condominium to impose a reasonable charge on a person desiring to review or copy the books and records; altering the kinds of books and records a homeowners association may withhold from public inspection under certain circumstances; and generally relating to the books and records of cooperative housing corporations, condominiums, and homeowners associations.

 - (II) AN INDIVIDUAL'S MEDICAL RECORDS;
 - (III) AN INDIVIDUAL'S FINANCIAL RECORDS;
