- (ii) [In addition, one additional Class A-1 or A-2 beer, wine, and liquor off-sale license may be issued by the Board for every 20,000 of population after July 1, 1984.
- (iii)] However, a B-1 temporary (on-sale) license may be issued to those persons who wish after six months to operate a bona fide Class B license. The B-1 license shall be revoked after the six-month period has expired if the licensee has not met all requirements for a Class B license.
- (3) The population figures are those specified by the State Department of Health and Mental Hygiene.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2004.

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 336 – Harford County Liquor Control Board – Service of Summonses by Inspectors of the Board.

This bill authorizes, that in Harford County, summonses for witnesses issued by the Liquor Control Board for the purpose of hearings and inquiries the board is authorized to hold or make to be served by inspectors employed by the board.

Senate Bill 225, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me on April 27, 2004, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign House Bill 336.
