

LIGHT WINES AND PORT WINES PRODUCED AT THE WINERY IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH.

(II) THE LIGHT WINES AND PORT WINES UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH:

1. MAY NOT EXCEED 23 PERCENT OF ALCOHOL BY VOLUME;
2. MAY BE SOLD IN ANY QUANTITY TO A CONSUMER; AND
3. SHALL BE SOLD AT RETAIL AT THE PLACE DESCRIBED IN

THE LICENSE.

(e) (1) This subsection applies only in the following counties:

- (i) Baltimore County;
- (ii) Frederick County;
- (iii) Garrett County;
- (iv) Harford County;
- (v) Somerset County;
- (vi) Talbot County; and
- (vii) Washington County.

(2) A Class A light wine license may be issued to a holder of a Class 3 manufacturer's license, who makes wine from agricultural products grown in Maryland.

(3) Baltimore County wineries applying for a Class A/Class 3 license are exempt from quotas established by the Baltimore County Liquor Board as to the number of licenses in that election district.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2004.

Dear Mr. Speaker:

In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, today I have vetoed House Bill 351 – *Maryland Health Care Foundation and Maryland Health Care Trust*.

House Bill 351 repeals the Maryland Health Care Foundation and establishes the Maryland Health Care Trust, to which the value of public or charitable assets must be
