- (3) (I) IF A CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION IS CONDITIONED ON THE PERMISSIBLE USE OF THE PROPERTY, THE PARTICIPANT SHALL SEND A COPY OF THE CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION TO A ONE–CALL SYSTEM, AS DEFINED IN \S 12–101 OF THE PUBLIC UTILITY COMPANIES ARTICLE.
- (II) ANY OBLIGATION FOR THE PARTICIPANT TO SEND THE INFORMATION REQUIRED UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH DOES NOT NEGATE THE OBLIGATION OF AN OWNER AS DEFINED UNDER § 12–101(F) OF THE PUBLIC UTILITY COMPANIES ARTICLE TO BECOME A MEMBER OF THE ONE-CALL SYSTEM UNDER TITLE 12 OF THE PUBLIC UTILITY COMPANIES ARTICLE.
- (e) Subject to the provisions of § 7-516(a) of this subtitle, if an owner of an eligible property that has limited permissible uses wants to change the use of the eligible property, the owner, subject to approval by the Department, is responsible for the cost of cleaning up the eligible property to the appropriate standard.
- (F) THE PARTICIPANT AND ANY SUCCESSORS IN INTEREST IN A PROPERTY SUBJECT TO A CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION SHALL CONTINUE TO BE PROTECTED FROM LIABILITY IN THE EVENT OF ANY VIOLATION OF THE CONDITIONS PLACED ON THE USE OF THE PROPERTY, PROVIDED THAT THE PARTICIPANT AND ANY SUCCESSORS IN INTEREST DID NOT CAUSE OR CONTRIBUTE TO THE VIOLATION. 7–515.
- (A) The provisions of §§ 7-256 through 7-268 of this title shall be used and shall apply to enforce violations of:
 - (1) This subtitle; or
 - (2) Any regulation adopted under this subtitle.
- (B) ANY ACTION TAKEN BY THE DEPARTMENT UNDER THIS SUBTITLE AT A SITE UNDER ACTIVE ENFORCEMENT MAY NOT:
- (1) NEGATE THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF ANY OUTSTANDING ACTIVE ENFORCEMENT ORDER, DECREE, JUDGMENT, PERMIT, OR OTHER DOCUMENT THAT ADDRESSES ENVIRONMENTAL CONTAMINATION AT THE SITE; OR
- (2) RELIEVE ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SUBJECT OF AN ACTIVE ENFORCEMENT ACTION FROM LIABILITY FOR PENALTIES UNDER THE ENFORCEMENT ACTION.

(f) In Anne Arundel County, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, OR BALTIMORE CITY, an agent or employee, or one or more assistants of the county JURISDICTION, after real and bona fide effort to notify the occupant or the owner, if the land is unoccupied or if the occupant is not the owner, may enter on any private land to make test borings and soil tests and obtain information related to such tests for the purpose of determining the possibility of public use of the property.
