- (a) There is a Task Force to Study Criminal Offender Monitoring by Global Positioning Systems.
 - (b) The Task Force shall be composed of:

- (2) two members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of the Senate;
- (3) The chief judge of the court of appeals, or a designee of the chief judge;

- (4) (5) the Secretary of Public Safety and Correctional Services, or a designee of the Secretary;
- (5) (6) the Superintendent of the Maryland State Police, or a designee of the Superintendent;
- (6) (7) the Director of the Division of Parole and Probation, or a designee of the Director;
- $\frac{(7)}{(8)}$ the Commissioner of the Division of Correction, or a designee of the Commissioner; and
 - (8) (9) the following members appointed by the Governor:
 - (i) one representative of the Maryland Chiefs of Police;
 - (ii) one representative of the Maryland State Sheriff's Association;
 - (iii) one State's attorney;
- (iv) one member of the judiciary of the State representative of the Maryland Municipal League;
 - (v) one representative of the Office of the Public Defender;
 - (vi) one representative of the Maryland Association of Counties;
 - (vii) one representative of a victim's rights organization;

- (ix) one representative of a domestic violence advocacy program; and
 - (x) one representative of the American Civil Liberities Union.
