- (2) The Governor shall designate the chairman of the Task Force.
- (d) A member of the Task Force:
 - (1) may not receive compensation; but
- (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel Regulations as provided in the State budget.
- (e) The Task Force shall meet at the times and places that the chairman determines.
 - (f) The Task Force shall:
- (1) study how Maryland can utilize Global Positioning technology to monitor:
 - (i) probationers;
 - (ii) parolees;
 - (iii) registered sex offenders;
 - (iv) drug offenders;
 - (v) juvenile offenders; and
 - (vi) individuals subject to:
 - 1. pre-trial supervision;
 - 2. early release; and
 - 3. domestic violence restraining orders;
- (2) study how law enforcement can benefit from linkage to Global Positioning technology to solve crimes and streamline workload;
- (3) study how such a system could be financed, including requiring offenders to pay for monitoring conduct a feasibility study, including a cost-benefit analysis, of implementing a global positioning technology program in the State;
- (4) study admissibility of evidence issues <u>and other issues that the task</u> force <u>considers relevant;</u>
 - (5) make legislative recommendations; and
 - (6) prepare a report summarizing its findings and recommendations.
 - (g) The Task Force shall submit:
- (1) an interim report to the Governor and subject to § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly on or before December 31, 2004; and
