CHAPTER 165

(House Bill 307)

AN ACT concerning

Criminal Law – Motion Picture Theaters – Prohibition against Audiovisual Recording

FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from knowingly operating an audiovisual recording function of a device in a motion picture theater without the consent of certain persons under certain circumstances; providing immunity from civil liability to a certain owner, lessee, agent, or employee who detains or causes the arrest of a certain person under certain circumstances; making the provisions of this Act severable; and generally relating to audiovisual recording in motion picture theaters.
