brake is installed and operated in accordance with the manufacturer's original design specifications connected to a properly functioning exhaust muffler system in constant operation when the vehicle's ignition is engaged; prohibiting a person from disabling the exhaust muffler system on a certain vehicle except under certain circumstances; establishing a certain penalty; defining a certain terms term; and generally relating to restricting the use of engine brakes.
