SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

**Chapter 178 of the Acts of 2004**

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
October 1, 2004. [It shall remain effective for a period of ~~3~~ 5 years and, at the end of  
September 30, ~~2007~~ 2009, with no further action required by the General Assembly,  
this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.]

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
July 1, 2007.

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**CHAPTER 478**

(House Bill 1372)

AN ACT concerning

**Student Health - Inhalant Abuse - Awareness Campaign and Education  
Requirements, Training, and Distribution of Materials  
(Mackenzie's Law)**

FOR the purpose of requiring the State ~~Superintendent of Schools~~ Department of  
Education, in collaboration with the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene,  
to ~~establish and promote in certain schools an information, awareness, and~~  
~~education campaign related to inhalant abuse; providing for the components of~~  
~~the campaign; authorizing the State Superintendent to use certain resources to~~  
~~carry out the provisions of this Act; requiring the State Board of Education to~~  
~~include the subject of inhalants and inhalant abuse in the curricula of the~~  
~~comprehensive health education program; requiring the State Board to submit a~~  
~~certain report to the General Assembly on or before a certain date~~ provide  
awareness and training for certain individuals on inhalant abuse; requiring the  
Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to provide to the State Department of  
Education certain information and materials on inhalant abuse; and generally
