FOR the purpose of prohibiting the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene from denying an individual home—and community based waiver services when the individual resides in a State residential center and certain criteria are mety providing that nothing in this Act is intended to result in a certain reduction of federal funds; requiring the Department to notify certain residents of State residential centers about certain opportunities to participate in a certain waiver; requiring the Department to submit a certain annual report; defining a certain term; and generally relating to individuals living in State residential centers and access to home—and community based waivers requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to make a certain date each year; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene and the Money Follows the Person grant.

## Preamble

WHEREAS, The Written Plan of Habilitation (§ 7-904 of the Health — General Article) requires that the individual written plan for each individual residing at a State residential center include a recommendation regarding the most integrated setting to meet the individual's needs and barriers to providing services in the most integrated setting; and

WHEREAS, Ninety percent of the individuals reviewed to date have a finding from the independent resource coordinator that community residential services are the most integrated setting; and

WHEREAS, The Department of Health and Mental Hygiene's report on the Written Plan of Habilitation for Individuals in State Residential Centers to the General Assembly states that "capacity is not a significant barrier for most individuals if funding is available"; and

WHEREAS, No funding has been provided in the Department's budget to transition individuals from State residential centers to appropriate community services; new, therefore,

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
