In accordance with Article II, Section 17 of the Maryland Constitution, today I have vetoed Senate Bill 62 - Somerset County - County Commissioners and Members of the County Roads Board - Salaries.

This bill increases the salaries of the County Commissioners for Somerset County and the members of the County Roads Board of Somerset County. It also establishes a salary for the President of the County Commissioners for Somerset County and the President of the County Roads Board and provides that the Act does not apply to the salary or compensation of the incumbent County Commissioners, President of the County Commissioners, members of the County Roads Board, or President of the County Roads Board.

House Bill 13, which was passed by the General Assembly and signed by me, accomplishes the same purpose. Therefore, it is not necessary for me to sign Senate Bill 62.

AN ACT concerning

Somerset County - County Commissioners and Members of the County Roads
Board - Salaries

FOR the purpose of increasing the salaries of the County Commissioners for Somerset County and the members of the County Roads Board of Somerset County; establishing a salary for the President of the County Roads Board; providing that this Act does not apply to the salary or compensation of the incumbent County Commissioners, President of the County Commissioners, members of the County Roads Board, or President of the County Roads Board; and generally relating to the salaries of the County Commissioners for Somerset County, the President of the County Commissioners for Somerset County, members of the County Roads Board of Somerset County, and the President of the County Roads Board of Somerset County.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, The Public Local Laws of Somerset County Section 2–101 and 9–104(a) Article 20 – Public Local Laws of Maryland
