Douglass Esq. Sheriff at Sheriff's Sale, under an Execution issued out of the Circuit Court of Dorchester County at. of Thos W. Byus vs Servis W. Palk To Have and To Hold said negroes named John Sarah above bargained and sold, to the said Servis Phillips, his Executors administrators and assigns forever. But I do not guarantee any title, or warrant against any persons but myself or those Claiming from or under me, it being the intention of these presents to convey simply the interest obtained by virtue of said Execution & the sale and purchase thereunder
