John Griffiths of Baltimore City, and State of Maryland, for and in Consideration of the sum of Three hundred and fifty dollars Current money to me in hand paid, by Asbury Menamara of Dorchester County and State of Maryland, have granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain and sell unto the said Asbury Menamara his heirs and assigns negro woman Sulie aged about twenty five years Slave for life and sound in body and mind, To Have and To Hold to the said negro woman Sulie as above bargained and sold unto the said Asbury Menamara his heirs, Executors, administrators and assigns, against me, the said John Griffiths my heirs, Executors and administrators, and against all and every other person or persons, whatsoever, shall and with warrant and force defend.

In Testimony whereof, I John Griffiths have hereunto set my hand and affixed seal, this 26th day of April, eighteen hundred and fifty four.
