

Creighton for myself my Heirs, Executors and administrators, the said negro Girl Emily unto the said George Mister his Executors, Administrators and Assigns, against me the said Augustus W. Creighton my Executors and Administrators, and against all and every other person or persons whatsoever, shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents.

Simmons, John Tubman of Dorchester County are held and firmly bound unto the State of Maryland in the full and just sum of Three hundred Dollars Current money of the United States to be paid to the said State or its certain attorney to the which paid well and truly to be made and done. We bind ourselves our heirs Executors and administrators in the whole and for the whole jointly and severally firmly by these presents sealed with our Seals and dated this Fifth day of May 1854. Whereas the County Commissioners for Dorchester County by virtue of a supplement to the act entitled an additional supplement to the act to regulate ferries have contracted with the said

Washington A. Smith & Thos B. Simmons to keep the ferry over Slaughter Creek from Taylors Island to Meehins Neck and agree to allow the said Washington A. Smith & Thomas B. Simmons to call faithfully and diligently keep the said ferry over Slaughter Creek from Taylors Island to Meehins Neck from day light to day light from the first of November to the first of March and from an hour before to an hour after day light for the residue of the year commencing the tenth of May 1854 and ending twelve months thereafter and shall keep Con-
