Be it remembered and it is hereby certified that the following Manumission was received and recorded on the 13th day of September A.D. 1854 to wit:

To all whom it may concern be it known that I Dulcena Scott of Dorchester County in the State of Maryland for divers good causes and considerations me thereunto moving have released from Slavery liberated manumitted and set free and by these presents do hereby release from Slavery liberate manumitted and set free as follows my negro man Williams Jerome now nineteen years old to serve till he is thirty one years old Louisa Jane nineteen years old the first of Sept^r next to serve till she is twenty six years old Emily Jane seventeen years old now to serve till she is twenty six years old Rachel Catharine sixteen years old next January to serve till she is twenty six years old Henry Clay twelve years old next July to serve till he is twenty eight years old Ebrey Dear Holoway nine years old to serve till he is thirty one years old I do declare the above named negroes to be manumitted and free after serving out the terms of years specified in the above instrument of writing from me my Executors or administrators forever. In witness whereof I Dulcena Scott have set my hand and affixed my seal this thirteenth day of June Eighteen Hundred and fifty four

Be it remembered and it is hereby certified that the following Bill of Sale was received and recorded on the 3 day of October in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and fifty four to wit:

Know all men by these presents that we L.W. Stewart wishes Maguire (Administrators of Henry Maguire deceased) of Dorchester County State of Maryland for and in consideration of the sum of five hundred and twenty dollars to them in hand paid by Martha Hicks of Baltimore City State of Maryland at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain & sell unto the said Martha Hicks her Executors administrators & assigns negro girl Sally now aged twelve years three months and eighteen days to serve as a slave until she attains to the age of forty five years consequently she will have to serve 33 years 8 months & 12 days she the said Sally having been a slave for life to the said Henry Maguire but by his will freed at the age of 45 years To Have and To Hold the said negro girl Sally unto her the said Martha Hicks her Executors administrators & assigns until the said girl Sally shall attain the full age of 45 years no longer. In witness whereof we L.W. Stewart & wishes Maguire the seller & Martha Hicks the buyer have hereunto set our hands & seals this 16 Sept 1854
