Chairs, one side board with writing desk, two Carpets, and one settee which was a present to her since our marriage and all singular my crockery, household furniture & cooking, and kitchen utensils and furniture now in the house in which I reside at Cabin creek in said County - To Have and To Hold all and singular the said goods household stuff and furniture above bargained and sold or mentioned or intended so to be to the said Annanda Fraley her heirs Executors administrators and assigns forever -
