1852 to wit:

This indenture made this twenty third day of August 1852 between Thomas S. Seecombe of the County of Worcester State of Maryland of the one part and De Witt Clinton Handley of the same State of the other part and De Witt Clinton Handley has become answerable and
bound as surety to the aforesaid Thomas James Seecombe for the payments of sundry
debts now due or about to become due and payable to certain divers Creditors of the said
Thomas S. Seecombe and the said Thomas S. Seecombe being desirous to secure and save
harmless the said De Witt Clinton Handley against all responsibility and risk as surety
of the debts and liabilities aforesaid; therefore this Indenture witnesseth, that the said
Thomas James Seecombe as well for and in consideration of securing the said surety
De Witt Clinton Handley from the payments of the said debts, or from the payments
of any part or parcel thereof, and for the further consideration of five dollars to him the
said Thomas S. Seecombe in hand paid by the said De Witt Clinton Handley at and
before the execution, sealing, and delivery hereof, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
that he granted, bargained, sold, released, and confirmed, and by these presents doth grant,
bargain, release, and confirm unto the said De Witt Clinton Handley his heirs and assigns
all and singular the goods, chattels, furniture and household stuff, hereinafter particularly
