Be it remembered and it is hereby Certified that the following Bill of Sale was received and recorded on the 24th day of April in the year of our Lord Eighteen Hundred and fifty five to wit: Know all men by these presents, that we Susan A. Greene and Septimus Thompson (administrators C. T. A. of Nathaniel E. Greene deceased) both of Dorchester County and State of Maryland, for and in consideration of the sum of fifteen hundred and fifty dollars lawful money of the United States, to us in hand paid by Sarah Lydia Thompson of said County at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged: Have granted, bargained, and sold, and by these presents Do grant, bargain and sell unto the said Sarah Lydia Thompson her Executors, Administrators, and Assigns, one negro man Jack slave for life aged about twenty six years; one negro girl Lucy slave for life aged about twenty two years; one negro woman Eliza slave for life aged about fifty years; one negro girl Betsy slave for life aged about ten years; one negro girl Mary slave for life aged about forty five years; one negro girl Mariak slave for life aged about thirteen years; one negro girl Mary slave for life, <sup>aged</sup> about twelve years; one negro boy George slave for life aged about eight years; one negro boy Saul slave for life aged about six years [All of which said Slaves were sold by the said administrators in pursuance of an order of the orphans of Baltimore County passed on the 17th day of April A. D. 1835] To Have and To Hold the said described negroes to the said Sarah Lydia Thompson her Executors, administrators, and Assigns forever.
