 Be it remembered and it is hereby certified, that the following Bill of Sale was received and recorded on the 31st day of December, Anno Domini 1855, to wit:
 I know all men by these presents, that I, Salomon Saunders of Dorchester County, for and in consideration of the sum of Six Hundred dollars current money, to me in hand paid by Sevins Seward of the same County at and before the sealing of these presents, the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge, I have granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents, do grant, bargain and sell unto the said Sevins Seward his executors, administrators and assigns: one negro Woman Susan, aged twenty two years, slave for life, sound and healthy. Do Have and Do Hold the said negro woman Susan, aged twenty two years, slave for life, above bargained and sold, or mentioned or intended so to be, to the said Sevins Seward his executors, administrators and assigns forever; and I the said Salomon Saunders, for myself, my heirs, executors and administrators, the said negro Woman Susan, unto the said Sevins Seward, his executors and administrators and assigns, against me the said Salomon Saunders, my executors, administrators, and against all and every other persons or persons whatsoever, shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents.
