Sarah Campfer seven years old Mary Campfer four years old Amanda Pinkie four years old and William Campfer two years old To Have and To Hold the aforesaid named negroes each of all slaves for life, above bargained and sold or intended so to be to the said Mary Bramble her executors, administrators and assigns forever. Bramble for myself my heirs executors and administrators the said negroes as above described all slaves for life unto the said Mary Bramble her executors administrators and assigns, against me the said Edward H.
