Chapman son of Dorchester County, in the State of Maryland, for the consideration of the sum of Seven Hundred and fifty Dollars current money to me in hand paid by Jesse Hubbard of Caroline County and State aforesaid, the receipt whereof, I do hereby acknowledge, have granted, bargained and sold and delivered, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and deliver unto the said Jesse Hubbard, my negroes slaves, John Henry Dick, who is said slave to serve till he is thirty years old, being till January 1872, and Mary Jane Dick, to serve to the same age being till January 1877, who is said slaves John A. Dick and Sarah S. Dick, I will warrant and defend to the said Jesse Hubbard his Executors, administrators and assigns, against my Executors and administrators, and against every other person or persons whomsoever. In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto set my name and affixed my seal this 26<sup>th</sup> day of June, in the year one thousand eight hundred and fifty six.

Rhades & Rich<sup>d</sup> Rhades of Dorchester County and State of Maryland, we held & firmly bound unto the State of Maryland, in the full and just sum of Three Hundred Dollars current money of the United States, to be paid to the said State or its certain Attorney, to the which payment well and truly to be made and done, we bind ourselves, our heirs, Executors and administrators in the whole and for the whole jointly and severally, firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals, and dated this eighth day of May, Eighteen Hundred and fifty six.
