Williams before said Court, at the November Term, to answer a charge or Indictment before said Court, tending for stealing a certain lot of 1 Bacon, the property of one William Britly, and for his continuing so to appear from day to day until he is legally discharged by said Court. Now this instrument Witnesseth, that for and consideration of the sum of Five Dollars, also due the said Brohawn & Wallace, for expenses incurred at the instance of the said W. Williams, the said Benjamin W. Williams & Sarah Ann W. Williams his wife, do grant unto the said John W. Brohawn and Thomas Wallace, all those several tracts of Land Called "Buck's Mill," & "Phillips Acquations," situated lying & being in the County aforesaid, and in the Election District No 1, & embracing the farms where the said W. Williams & wife now reside, containing about sixty acres of land more or less, also one yoke of oxen, 2 Cows, one calf, 9 head of Hogs and four Hens. Provided, that if the said Benjamin W. Williams, shall appear before the Circuit Court of Dorchester County, to be held in Cambridge on the second Monday of November next, to answer the charge or Indictment aforesaid, & shall so continue to appear from day to day until he shall be legally discharged by the said Court, & in all respects save harmless & free from all loss whatsoever or the said John W.
