Dravers, the said negro boy Dolme, for the term of six years and ten months from the first day of March next ensuing, the said negro being a slave for the term of six years and two months from the first day of March next ensuing, or until the first day of January Eighteen hundred and sixty four, and no longer, and the said Samuel M. Dravers, being entitled to said slave for the whole of said term. Witness our hands and seals this twenty fourth day of February, Eighteen Hundred and Fifty seven.
