Dorman to secure to the said G. 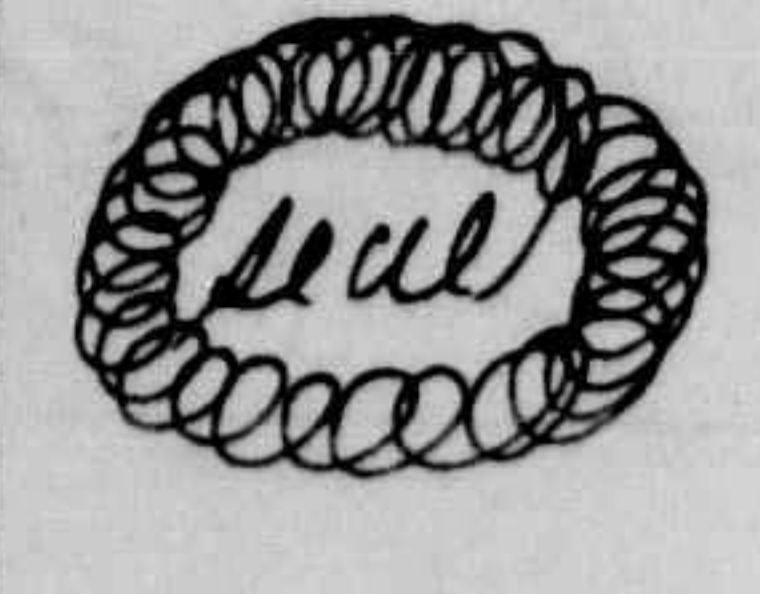
