Dulcena Scott Do & Sundry Negroes Be it remembered and it is hereby certified, that the following Deed of Manumission was received and recorded on the 27th day of July 1857, to wit: To all whom it may concern, Be it known that I, Dulcena Scott of Dorchester County, in the State of Maryland, for divers good causes and considerations me therunto moving, have released from slavery, liberated, manumitted and set free, and by these presents do hereby release from slavery, liberate manumit and set free the following negroes, to wit: Negro Manam Maria Jane Willson and her four children viz Samuel, Francis, James and John, which said negroes I do declare to be henceforth free from me and my executors, administrators and assigns forever. In Witness Whereof, I the said Dulcena Scott, hath here unto set my hand and affixed my seal this 21st day of December, Anno Domini 1855. -
