Cooper and Robert W. Lewis, their heirs, executors and administrators, and every of them by these presents, hath granted bargained and sold (and by these presents, doth grant, bargain and sell, unto the said William O. Cooper and Robert W. Lewis their executors administrators and assigns, all and singular the personal property, hereinafter particularly mentioned and expressed, that is to say one negro boy called and known by the
