I, Charles V. Crockett, of Worcester County, State of Maryland, being now indebted to Greensbury Stett and George E. Austins, of said County and State, in the sum of Five hundred and twenty five Dollars, with interest from date of these presents, in consideration thereof, do hereby bargain and sell to the said Greensbury Stett and George E. Austins, the following property, to wit: one Chestnut coloured Horse, one Carriage and Harness, one yoke of Oxen, one wain Cart, one timber Cart, one Scau, one red and white Cow, one hundred bushels of Corn, six Stacks of Blade & top fodder, one Roller, 2 ploughs, two Harrows, two Beds, Bedsteads and furniture, seventeen Cords of pine wood at Cain ditch Landing, and seventy Cords of pine wood in the woods, 2 doz hair seat Chairs. Provided, that if the said Charles V. Crockett, shall pay to the said Greensbury Stett and George E. Austins, the sum of Five hundred and twenty five Dollars, with interest thereon on or before the first day of June, A.D. 1858, then these presents shall be void. Provided, that in default of payment the said Greensbury Stett and George E. Austins, may sell the above mortgaged property in the following manner, by auction for Cash at Bucktown, at three weeks public notice of the time, place and manner and terms of Sale, in one newspaper published in Cambridge, once a week for three successful weeks, prior to the day of sale to pay the debt, and the surplus if any over to the said Charles V. Be it remembered and it is hereby Certified, that the following Deed of Manumission was received and recorded on the 4th day of January, Anno Domini, 1858, to wit: -
To all whom it may concern, be it known that I, J. W. Henry, of Worcester County, in the State of Maryland, for divers good causes and considerations, me thereunto moving, have released from slavery, liberated, manumitted, and set free, and by these presents do hereby release from slavery, liberate, manumit and set free my negro man, Levin Parker, he being able to work and gain a sufficient livelihood & maintenance, and him the said negro man named Levin Parker, I do declare to be henceforth free, manumitted and discharged, from all manner of service or servitude to me, my executors or administrators, forever. - In Witness Whereof, the said J. W. Henry, has hereunto set his hand and seal, on this 25th day of December, Eighteen hundred and fifty seven.
