And I, the party of the first part, do for myself, my heirs, Executors and administrators, covenant and agree, to and with the said party of the second part, to warrant and defend the sale of the said negro girl Angeline, hereby sold unto the said party of the second part, her Executors, administrators and assigns, against all and every person and persons whomsoever. In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto subscribed my name and affixed my seal, this twenty sixth day of January, Anno Domini, eighteen hundred and fifty eight (1858)
